

### Accident Survival Checklist

Place this in your vehicle for use after a collision

- Keep calm and try not to move your vehicle immediately.
- Call the emergency services if anybody is injured or if you suspect an offence has been committed by the other motorist (such as drink driving) Also call the police if the other driver refuses to provide their details to you.
- Gather as much evidence as you can, such as the registration number, name & address for the other driver, any insurance details.
- Take pictures of the positions of the vehicles in the road, showing where any glass or debris has fallen. Take pictures of the damage to each vehicle involved.
- Take down names and contact details for any witnesses – they may be vital to proving your claim, even if the other driver admits liability to you at the scene.
- Note down the road name or number where the accident happened.
- Exchange your own information with the other driver – the exchange of insurance details after a collision is mandatory.
